

Water-ski schools offer the boat-less amateur the easiest way to get on the water. The definition of "school" is fairly loose. Most schools have USA Water Ski-sanctioned instructors, and many offer boats and drivers at hourly rates. "You don't have to take lessons at a ski school," says water-ski legend Mark Jackson. "If you call or walk in the door wanting to ski, most schools are going to be pretty flexible, depending on your level of experience."
